I am a freelance journalist. From the beginning of 2017 to February 22, 2018, I worked on a journalistic investigation into the case of serial killings in Tuscany between 1974 and 1985 attributed to a serial killer dubbed "Monster of Florence" by the media. The journalistic investigation led me to meet Giuseppe Bevilacqua, aka Joe, a witness for the Prosecution in the first instance trial of Pietro Pacciani, who was acquitted on appeal of the accusation of being the serial killer.

Giuseppe Joe Bevilacqua is a highly decorated veteran of the Vietnam War and a former agent of the Criminal Investigation Command of the Military Police of the United States of America. At the time of the murders, Bevilacqua had discharged the army and was working at the Falciani American Cemetery, first as deputy superintendent and then as superintendent. Bevilacqua lived 300 meters as the crow flies from the place of discovery, in September 1985, of the two victims of the latest double murder charged to the serial killer.

I met Bevilacqua for the first time in May 2017, at his home. I went to meet him about fifteen times (error - six times TN) during the summer. The meetings took place at his home in [REDACTED], with one exception, at the end of July 2017, that was a visit to the American Cemetery and a stop at Bar Marconi, in the locality of Falciani (Florence).

On September 11, 2017 (error - September 12 TN), during a conversation on the phone between me and Bevilacqua, he admitted to being the serial killer who committed the crimes of the so-called "Monster of Florence", the perpetrator of at least 14 murders in the Italian territory. During the phone call I advised Bevilacqua to turn himself in to the Judicial Authority, preferably accompanied by a priest. During the call, Bevilacqua reiterated several times that what prevented him from turning himself in was his concern "not to get others into trouble".

I have not heard from Bevilacqua since 13 September 2017.
